Toys for Tots



Past-President Roger Pilcher reported that GS MOAA Chapter members donated 150 toys to the 2020 Toys for Tots program. The Chapter also purchased Food Lion meals and food cards for distribution to those in need. Thanks to all who generously donated to this annual collection the Marine Reserves gave out 32,500 toys to needy children impacted by the pandemic, a tremendous jump over last year's record 8,500 toys.

SC Council of MOAA Chapters and MOAA National Updates

National and State MOAA continue to fight hard to pass major state and federal legislation to help needy veterans and their families during the ongoing pandemic. Priorities include: completing full ex-

emption of military retirement pay from South Carolina income tax for retired military and their spouses; crediting life experience towards high school and college credit; allowing military spouse licensures to reciprocate across state boundaries; and more. In addition, the SC Council of MOAA Chapters formed a new Legislative Affairs Committee & invited GS MOAA member, Jim Offutt, to be an inaugural member. Congratulations Jim!



Grand Strand MOAA Veterans Outreach and Career Advancement

<u>Stand Downs</u> - Two Stand Downs have been funded and approved by the VA for 2021: one in Myrtle Beach (Army Reserve Center at Market Common) and one in Aynor (Waccamaw Tribal Grounds). At present these are expected to be drive-through models like we held in 2020. Additional Stand Downs will be held as more funding and sponsors come forward.

<u>Eastern Carolina Housing Organization (ECHO)</u> -- GS MOAA provided 3 mailbox keys to ECHO veteran residents & 150 bus passes to be used by veterans seeking job interviews, or traveling to/from medical or legal appointments. In addition, ECHO installed GS MOAA furnished computer equipment to help veteran residents conduct job searches. GS MOAA members will meet with interested ECHO Veterans on a bi-weekly basis to provide guidance and conduct job search training seminars starting 8 March 2021.

MOAA Covid Emergency Family Grants - GS MOAA applicants received 8 additional MOAA Covid Grants during this period, bringing the total to 13 approved grants ranging from \$440 to \$1000 for veterans who suffered financial hardships directly related to COVID. Thanks to several GS MOAA members for their help with applicants to get these funds.

<u>Food Cards</u> - GS MOAA donated over \$5,000 in Food Lion Food Cards to the Myrtle Beach Veteran Center, Low Country Veterans Group (LCVG) and VA for Christmas. Individual Veterans received \$50 food cards and Veteran Families received \$100 food cards. A total of 125 veterans and family members were helped by these Food Cards.

<u>MOAA Community Outreach 2021 Grant</u> - GS MOAA completed a MOAA national grant application for \$5,000 along with a Press Release detailing our Outreach accomplishments in 2020. We should hear if our application was accepted in May 2021.

<u>Veteran Employment/Training</u> Currently five veterans found new jobs working with GS MOAA, Horry-Georgetown Technical College (HGTC) and Palmetto Goodwill. In addition, four veterans are currently in HGTC Vocational Training Classes. An additional four veterans have expressed interest in the next HGTC HVAC program, scheduled to begin in Aug 2021.

<u>Chamber of Commerce Vocational Training Meeting</u> - Thanks to Jerry Terwilliger, GS MOAA members met with Myrtle Beach Chamber of Commerce Business Development officials to explain our new vocational training/employment program with HGTC and others. The program was well received and the Chamber agreed to host a zoom meeting on 14 Mar with other Horry County Chambers for us to explain the program to each of them hoping to get the message out to businesses that may provide our veteran students with potential job interviews and offers.

JROTC Scholarships

This year we continue our Junior ROTC Scholarship program by awarding \$2,000 scholarships to four (4) highly qualified cadets. We have contacted all 17 schools and provided applications to each military instructor. The application deadline is 16 April and we will invite all awardees, their families and instructors to a celebratory lunch on May 11th (location TBD). As in previous years, donations to the scholarship fund are always welcome and are tax deductible. Veterans Administration COVID Vaccination Guidance

Many VA health facilities offer COVID-19 vaccines to veterans who already receive care at VA, **and** are at least 75 years old or has health problems that increase risk for severe illness from COVID-19. Some facilities also offer vaccines to Veterans 65 years and older.

If you're a Veteran who already receives care at VA, your facility will contact you when you can get a vaccine. To learn about your facility's current plan, <u>find the facility's website</u>. Once you're on the site, go to **Health care services**, then **COVID-19** in the menu.

Some designated family caregivers may also be able to get a COVID-19 vaccine at VA. For a caregiver to be eligible for a vaccine, the caregiver must be enrolled in our Program of Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers (PCAFC), and the Veteran they care for must be currently eligible for a vaccine based on VA and CDC risk criteria. If you're an eligible caregiver, we'll tell you if you can get a vaccine when we invite the Veteran to get one.

Please wait for us to contact you about getting a COVID-19 vaccine. You don't need to call us or come to a VA health facility to reserve or request a vaccine. You'll need to wait at least 14 days between getting a COVID-19 vaccine and any other vaccine. Your VA health facility may invite you to get a COVID-19 vaccine at a large vaccination event or by appointment. You may receive an invite by phone, email, or text message. If you're eligible and you want a vaccine, we encourage you to respond. But make sure the phone call, email, or text is really from VA before you provide any personal information or click on any links. Text messages will always come from 53079. Emails will always come from a va.gov email address.

For ongoing updates on our COVID-19 vaccine plan, <u>sign up for email updates</u>. For more details on your local VA health facility's current plan, <u>find your facility's website</u>. Once you're on the facility's website, go to **Health care services**, then **COVID-19** in the menu. For answers to general questions about getting a vaccine at VA, <u>read our FAQs below</u> or <u>use our coronavirus chatbot</u>. If you don't find your answer there, call our MyVA411 main information line at <u>800-698-2411</u> (TTY: 711).

For more information about how your personal risk for COVID-19 will determine when you can get a vaccine, send a secure message to your VA health care provider. If you don't receive care at VA, contact your primary health care provider.
