Finally, Andy injected a little humor into his presentation when he described a publicity stunt he was involved in during a game in 2014 as a means of raising funds for a personal friend battling cancer as well as raising awareness of men's health issues.

Sharon Russell, Vice President of the Coastal Carolina Chapter of Blue Star Mothers encouraged those attending the dinner meeting to participate in the wreath laying ceremonies at the National Cemetery in Florence, SC.



President Dave Townsend presented Mrs. Russell with a \$500 contribution from the Chapter to purchase additional wreaths for placement at veterans graves. Mrs. Russell also reminded the Chapter that the Blue Star mothers are preparing holliday "Care" packages for troops deployed overseas.



Second Vice President (Membership) John Bradley reported to the Chapter that members will soon have the option of paying dues, making reservations for dinner

MOAA-Eggs Up Grill Initiative "Coffee with a Veteran" by Greg Youngman

On November 9th, eighteen Grand Strand Chapter volunteers participated in a successful new fundraising partnership with 9 Eggs Up Grill (EUG) restaurants located throughout the Grand Strand. At this initiative, entitled "Coffee with a Vet", our volunteers were on hand to represent veterans and interact with restaurant customers, veterans and their families, and families of those currently serving. Proceeds from the sales of all beverages will be disseminated to needy veterans and their families in Horry and Georgetown counties through MOAA and its partners.

The project was a joint effort between the consortium of Eggs Up Grill owners and managers and our MOAA Chapter. At the event, flyers were available upon request that highlighted Area Veterans Resources, Chapter Accomplishments (2014 thru 2017), and membership applications for the Chapter

Planning began for the fundraiser in early September with Joe Burger, an official of the Eggs Up Grill. A Chapter Committee (Greg Youngman, Bob Hawkins, Rufus Manning, and Greg Hill) was organized to identify the potential needs of various veteran charitable organizations and needy veteran families. Since the Chapter has donated previously to many of the area veteran organizations throughout the Grand Strand Area, the committee was charged with identifying new veteran

donation sites and areas that required further funding.

In consultation with the Eggs Up Grill consortium and the Chapter' Board of Directors, the committee recommended that the funds be donated to area needy veterans and their families to purchase groceries over the holiday season. The fundraiser raised over \$4500 that will benefit approximately 40 veterans and their families in the Horry and Georgetown areas. Monies will be distributed through the Vets Center in Myrtle Beach and the Low Country Veterans group in Georgetown in early December.

This cooperative venture with Eggs Up Grill and the Chapter enabled us to continue to strengthen our outreach efforts with local veteran resources and to directly reach needy veteran families throughout our community. In addition, it continued to reflect our Chapter's mission of playing a pivotal role in pursuing community veteran outreach projects that benefit our veteran population throughout the Grand Strand area! Our hope is that it will be a successful and cooperative annual event in the years to come.

Flu Season is here! Veterans protect yourselves and get a NO COST flu shot!

The cold and flu season is upon us and the Department of Veterans Affairs has once again teamed up with **Walgreens Pharmacies** nationwide to allow all veterans who are currently enrolled in the VA healthcare system to be able walk into any of the over 8000 Walgreens nationally to receive a vaccination at no cost. Vaccinations will be available through March 31, 2018.

Veterans wishing to receive the no cost vaccination simply need to present a Veterans Identification Card and a photo ID, at any participating Walgreens to receive the vaccination. The Group ID is: VAFLU

In addition, after the Walgreens pharmacist administers the vaccine Walgreens will transmit that information securely to VA where it becomes part of the patient's electronic medical record.

VA is committed to keeping Veteran patients healthy, and during this flu season, vaccination is the best way to prevent the spread of flu. No matter where you live, visit your local VA clinic or Walgreens to get a no cost flu shot.

Veterans Can Apply for ID Card

Honorably discharged veterans of all eras who want a new identification card from the Department of Veterans Affairs will be able to apply online by registering with the VA and uploading a photo, officials said. A 2015 law requires the VA to issue a hard-copy photo ID to any honorably discharged veteran who applies. To apply for the card, veterans must register with Vets.gov, a process that authenticates users through the ID.me system
