As we approach the new year of 2019, allow me to reflect on our 2018 membership year. The Chapter started the year with 132 members, having lost quite a few in January due to lack of dues payment. We set a goal of

Chapter revenues and expenditures for the past month reflect the significant funds we received from the annual Eggs Up Grill "Breakfast with a Vet" fundraising event and the expenditure of those funds to help needy veterans. Over \$4500 of the revenue figures below represent the funds received from the Eggs Up Grill event. The remainder came from dues, dinner receipts, and scholarship donations. Over \$4600 of the expenditure figure below are the funds used to provide grocery store cards to families of veterans. Remaining expenses include preparation for the 2019 golf tournament, dinner expenses, and Chapter administration.

Eggs Up Grill Helps Us Help Vets

On November 9th, 20 Grand Strand Chapter volunteers participated in our second annual fundraising partnership with Eggs Up Grill (EUG) restaurants throughout the Grand Strand. Entitled "Breakfast with a Vet," this initiative enables MOAA volunteers to represent veterans while interacting with restaurant customers, other veterans and their families at each of the nine EUG locations. Chapter volunteers also disseminate flyers identifying area veterans resources, Chapter accomplishments, and MOAA membership applications. EUG restaurants owners/managers, led by Joe Burger, pledged 15% of that day's total breakfast revenue to support needy veterans and their families in Horry and Georgetown counties.

Begun in September, "Breakfast with a Vet" planning included coordinating through Mr. Burger and the establishment of a Chapter committee comprised of Greg Youngman, Rufus Manning, and Greg Hill. The committee worked with the Veterans' Resource Center in Myrtle Beach and the Low Country Veterans organization in Georgetown to identify those in need.

The committee recommended, as it did last year, to provide gift cards funds to needy veterans and their families to purchase groceries during the holidays. Approximately 43 veterans and their families in Horry and Georgetown Counties will benefit from the funds raised.

This partnership between Eggs Up Grill and the Chapter enabled us to expand and strengthen our outreach efforts with local veteran support organizations and to directly reach needy veteran families throughout our community. The initiative has provided nearly \$10,000 over the last two years for local veterans during the holiday season, reflecting our Chapter's mission of pursuing community projects that benefit our veteran population throughout the Grand Strand area! Our hope is that it will be a successful and cooperative annual event in the years to come.

Grants, Events Help More Vets

Dedicated Grand Strand Chapter members work hard to raise funds to support veterans in Horry and Georgetown Counties. The Eggs Up Grill partnership (see the article to the left) headed up by Past President Greg Youngman is just one of those efforts. Jerry Terwilliger and Tony Prince collaborate each year with Gordon Biersch Brewery in Market Common to host a Tap Night through which a portion of the restaurant's sales are donated to the Chapter to assist veterans. This year that event will provide over \$900 to Chapter programs. Then there is the work done by Michael Freeman, Greg Hill, and Rufus Manning to obtain grants that finance additional assistance to veterans. For two consecutive years, their work has resulted in MOAA National awarding the Chapter Military Family Initiative (MFI) grants totaling \$8750 to help finance Chapter programs like Stand Down aimed at assisting local veterans. In conjunction with that grant, Michael, Greg, and Rufus have been able to obtain two Homes for Heroes Foundation (H4H) grants totaling \$5000 to assist homeless or near homeless veterans. Finally, dozens of members and their spouses volunteer to support the annual golf tournament which is critical to funding Chapter scholarships and JROTC support programs. All of these efforts and the subsequent effort to put those funds to use on behalf of area veterans deserve a round of applause.
