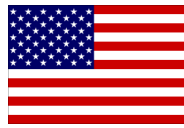
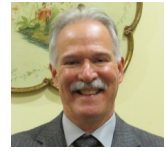
Yes, Lt. Gen. Mike Davison, Jr. will be speaking at our March meeting where he will learn about his stellar

Grand Strand Receives National Acclaim

Our Grand Strand Chapter programs have garnered national recognition by National MOAA in recent weeks. First, a photo of our volunteers at Stand Down 2018 was selected to promote National MOAA's fund raising for the MOAA Foundation. National MOAA Vice-President Mike Turner explained to our chapter in January that the fund raising effort has been adopted to finance future Foundation's grants. Grand Strand Chapter has received one of those grants in each of its first two years. In addition, MOAA asked President Randy Dymond for a quote to use to accompany the picture. Our use of the grant to assist needy veterans at Stand Down and elsewhere has set an example for other chapters to emulate, and that has been recognized by the leadership at National MOAA.

Secondly, Grand Strand Chapter's assistance to members of the US Coast Guard unit in Georgetown during the recent partial government shutdown were highlighted in National MOAA's recognition of chapters assisting military families. Because the Coast Guard is part of the Department of Homeland Security, which was one of the executive departments left unfunded during the shutdown, Coast Guard personnel could not be paid, leaving USCG personnel including unit in Georgetown in difficult financial circumstances. The Georgetown community, led by the Pawley's Island Community Church and others, rallied around the approximately 50-person Coast Guard unit stationed there to provide basic needs to these dedicated service members. Grand Strand MOAA joined that effort after Treasurer Tony Prince brought the situation to our attention. The Board of Directors expeditiously approved purchasing twenty \$50 gift cards for distribution to the Coast Guard families.

National MOAA's recognition of our Chapter's work on behalf of veterans and military personnel is a testament to our strong commitment to assist those who serve and who have served our country in uniform. Congratulations to all members who have been a part of these efforts in any way.

Financially, January is generally a fairly slow month, and this

year was no exception. Our total revenues and expenses during the month and our bank balance at end of the month are below.

Our major expenses in January consisted of \$1180 for our monthly dinner meeting and the \$1000 we spent to assist the US Coast Guard personnel in Georgetown (see story to the left). Other expenses came from support for the annual golf tournament and administrative costs.

Revenue in January came from receipts from our dinner meeting. In addition, we received the funds raised at our annual Gordon Biersch Tap Night. This year's event raised a total of \$935, the best ever for that fundraising event.

CCU's Dr. Craft Shares Her Experiences

Dr. LaMesha Craft (CW3, USA, Ret) gave an insightful and entertaining perspective of her 20 year career in the US Army at the Chapter's February 12 dinner meeting. Dr. Craft joined Coastal Carolina University in 2018 as a lecturer in its



Department of Politics after a 20 year career as an All-Source Intelligence Warrant Officer. Her after dinner remarks to the chapter focused on the challenges she faced in her military career as a female in a male-dominated career field and as a single mother.

During her career, Dr. Craft provided strategic and operational intelligence analysis of nation-state and non-state threats to U.S. interests, policy, data, and networks in/around Asia, Europe, the Horn of Africa, the Middle East, Southwest Asia. She has also worked overseas in Kosovo, Germany, Kuwait, and Iraq. Her comprehensive guide to applying military intelligence doctrinal processes when analyzing the cyber threat has been recognized as a "best practice" by the Center for Army Lessons Learned and has been requested by several allied nations. She also presented a lecture on Cyber Conflict and Geopolitics at CCU's 2019 Great Decisions lecture series.

Veterans Outreach by Michael Freeman



Grand Strand MOAA recently provided mail box keys for veterans housed by the Eastern Carolina Homelessness Organization. Grand Strand MOAA provides administration and funding for the United States Postal Service to rekey residential mailboxes. Having a home mailing address allows these veterans to obtain identification documents,

apply for aid, permit voter and vehicle registration and assist in job hunting. This is an important chapter program supporting veterans transitioning to civilian life or getting back on their feet after an unanticipated set back in life. ECHO is one of our chapter's partners on programs assisting homeless or near homeless veterans.

National MOAA Sets 2019 Priorities

Although the calendar year is changing, you can expect to see some of the same goals from MOAA's advocacy team year over year.

MOAA supporters will work directly with members of Congress to ensure our interests are properly represented. All members should contact their Members of Congress to express their views on these issues, which are as follows:

- ◆ Ensure any TRICARE reform sustains access to top-quality care.
- ◆ Prevent disproportional TRICARE fee increases.
- ◆ The Goal: Sustain military pay comparability with the private sector.
- ◆ The Goal: Stop erosion of compensation and non-pay quality-of-life benefits.
- ◆ The Goal: End financial penalties for military survivors.
- ◆ The Goal: End concurrent receipt penalties for military retirees.
